Jakobs), and his participation in several commentaries of the Spanish penal code are to be highlighted. Other publications (books, chapters, articles, case discussions), regarding Criminal Law principles, Criminal Law legal dogmatics, compared Criminal Law studies, European Criminal Law and several single offences (sexual crimes, terrorism, personal injuries, crimes against the environment, organised crime), have been published in Spain, most countries of Latin America, Germany, the United States, Italy, Portugal, Great Britain, Belgium, Finland, Turkey, Taiwan, and China.

He has been and is a member of and responsible researcher for a series of Spanish and European funded research projects in Criminal Law.

He is a member of the advisory boards of several Spanish, Latin American and German Journals on Criminal Law.
